Nancy Newman spends her professional life as a financial advisor with the investment firm of Morgan Stanley. That job may not be unusual today, but in 1981 when she started her career, only 10% of the employees were women. Not only was she among the small number of women in her field -- she was exceptional. Nancy became Dean Witter's first woman manager for the West Coast. There was only one other woman with upper management responsibility in the United States, and she was located on the East Coast.

Eventually Nancy managed Dean Witter/Morgan Stanley offices in San Luis Obispo, Irvine and Ventura. She has been with the firm, now known as Morgan Stanley, for more than 40 years. She returned to being a financial advisor (rather than manager) with friends and family as primary clients. She works part time out of her University Village apartment, but soon will be back in her Oxnard office.

Born in Ventura, Nancy moved to Alaska (when she was a baby during the Korean War) because her dad was a doctor in the military. His profession brought the family back to California for a short stay, then to lowa, and finally back to the Golden State. Nancy found her new home a kid's paradise. She grew up in Redondo Beach enjoying volleyball and body

surfing at the beach. The family then moved to Palos Verdes where she attended high school and a summer break at the University of Dijon in France. After graduation Nancy enrolled at UCLA where she majored in History and Social Science. She also holds an MBA from Cal State Bakersfield, where she has taught marketing and management.

Nancy met her former husband, Brad Newman, at UCLA some 50 years ago, as well as his two roommates — Bob Quinn and Tom McDaniel. The three are still friends. She encouraged Quinn and his wife, Tiese, to move to University Village. Nancy serves on the board of the McDaniel Family Foundation, which allowed her to visit villages in Nepal with the non-profit Heifer International.

"My first loves as a child were cowboys and horses," Nancy recalls. "I begged my parents for a horse, but they responded: when you grow up

and can afford it, you can get your horse."
And Nancy did!
Jordan, her horse for 14 years, could show in the ring, gather cattle, or trail ride through the sierras and into Zion National Park. For a few years,



she also had a cutting horse named Peekaboo (a type of working cattle horse) that was shown at a world championship for four to five years. Besides horseback riding, Nancy has enjoyed swimming, scuba diving, body surfing, skiing, and trips.

"My former mother-in-law lived in a retirement community in Santa Barbara which introduced me to the concept of continuing care. As I have no children, it was even more appealing. Living the last eight years in Ventura, I learned of UVTO. I visited and interested my friends, the Quinns, in the idea of moving here. My dogs and I moved in October 2020."
